## WHY DO SOME TECHS **PINCH THE NAIL?**

The act or art of pinching the nail was first seen in the early 90's by Tom Holcomb during L&P nail competitions. To keep the nail thin as paper without losing the sidewalls or structure during filing, he had to fold down the sides or pinch the nail during the curing process. This slimming of the nail, created a deeper c-curve, and strengthened the entire nail structure, evolving the 'perfect nail' to be even thinner. The benefits of this technique stretch far beyond the competition floor. Today it's widely used by most technicians to strengthen the structure of the nail, create straight or tapered sidewalls, and beautify the overall look allowing the fingers and nails to appear slimmer, and elongated.


# FINGERFASHION


Taken from the world of fine art, aquarelle is inspired by watercolor art. Using traditional watercolors or watereddown acrylic paints, you can create soft movement and sheer shading. Water droplets are placed on the nail, then small amounts of paint are placed on the droplets, left to settle for a few seconds before being carefully merged together. As the water evaporates a watercolor design is left behind.

## PEEL BACK THE POLISH: ERIKO KUROSAKI


From as early as 1994 Japan's Eriko Kurosaki gave the international nail world a reason to take note as she began taking 1st place trophies in

all the top global nail competitions in cities across the USA and Japan. This garnering of accolades in both design and sculpture categories led to Eriko being awarded 1st place in NAILS magazine's TOP25 Competitors in Y2K. This success meant Eriko became the first Japanese manicurist to achieve global recognition and honour in the industry.

"Back in the 90's in Japan, having your nails groomed was rare and considered a luxury. I was just 19 years old and couldn't afford to pay the high prices, so I decided to learn the skills myself," confides Eriko.

Learning her craft from Sachiko Nakasone of the NSJ Nail Academy and from the late Tom Holcomb (arguably the world's greatest nail tech having won over 200 international competitions, who also innovated nail techniques and products), Eriko focused on the art of nails by immersing herself in practice and closely observing her mentors. Even to this day Eriko reflects fondly and respectfully on those early days noting, "It was a first for Japan to be winning trophies in the nail industry and I was able to show my appreciation and gratitude for Tom's strong mentorship by receiving first place honours in the world championship's acrylic sculpture category. To date competing alongside Tom remains a career highlight for me."

Acrylic sculpture quickly became Eriko's strongest skill and to date it's blended with her signature style of Kawaii nail art, to form the most stunning, flawless, delicate and pristine nail enhancements in the world today. Highlighting that it's the magical aspect of transforming a nail through technique that has kept her passion for nails alive and thriving, Eriko shares, "The nail industry is an active community for women and there's nothing holding it back, that's what I love most about it. It's an exciting field with inspiration everywhere; design ideas can be fabricated from a simple walk down the street." A guiding light for any self-respecting nail professional, Eriko's more than two-decades learning and leading the Japanese nail industry is to be praised, as she cites herself, "When I started out, nail salons and manicurists were not a normal part of everyday life in Japan. It was around the year 2000 that Japan's nail industry began to emerge. It then grew rapidly from there and began accruing recognition. There's still no mandatory national certification in Japan for manicurists to attain, however, the Japan Nailist Association (JNA www.nail.or.jp) has been very successful in leading the industry in the right direction, thus raising the bar for the entire nail community. There's many salons that focus only on nails and clients in general are now looking for quality results with great customer service rather than lower priced, quick nails. This makes manicurists in Japan very well-respected compared to other parts of the world. In fact, the manicurist sits in the 'top five most admired jobs in Japan' listing." Having been instrumental in the shaping of the Japanese nail industry Eriko is




future will see much more learning, which online become apparent has been accelerated and due to the pandemic," states Eriko. "Although COVID-19 has changed our everyday lives in so many ways, the nail industry remains valid. I believe we should work together to create joy by mastering nail techniques by moving into the future with our class-based and online learning. Lockdown gave me the time I needed to think and get clear in my mind what I wanted to accomplish and grow. I now know I want to bring a smile to not only the nail community, but the whole of the beauty world." Leaving with words of wisdom for those looking to enter the nail industry, Eriko advises, "It's a wonderful profession that can bring a smile to people's faces from your nail skills! After the colors are applied use a clean liner brush to glide from top to bottom to make the desired effect. Repeat this motion, cleaning the brush with each stroke. When design is complete, cure.


