


BACK to basics CAMOUFLAGING FLAWS



WHAT YOU NEED

180-grit file, buffer, monomer, selection of cover pinks in your chosen L&P system, dappen dish, acrylic brush, lint-free wipes, cuticle pusher, nail prep, primer, nail forms, UV/LED top coat gel, manicure brush.


GETTING PREPARED

Prepare your table in an organized manner eliminating cross contamination from the products. Make sure all necessary products are within hand's reach, so the products are ready to use on the nail desk.

PREPARE NAILS & IDENTIFY DAMAGE



File the free edges of the nails.



Gently push back the cuticle.



Lightly buff the surface of the nails with a 180-grit buffer.

PRO TIPS

• Visible damage to the nails may come off by lightly buffing the nail.



After buffing, assess the nails.

CAMOUFLAGE THE DAMAGE



You can easily match the cover powders to your client's skin tone by placing Scotch tape on their hand & applying beads of cover powder to the tape to see which most closely matches the skin tone.



6 Now move the strip of Scotch tape to the fingers to match the cover powder to the nail bed.



7 Choose 3 cover pinks that match your client's skin tone.



Brush your chosen system's nail prep & primer onto the natural nail plate.

PRO TIPS

• The drier the bead is, the more opaque it will appear.



Pick up a bead of the most opaque cover pink & let out the excess monomer.



Place the bead on the damaged area of the nail. Lightly tap it down, do not tap too hard, as you need it to cover the damage not become sheer.



Blend the edge of the bead out. Just like facial concealer, the thickest part of the bead will go over the damage, then blend out to look natural.



Pick up a bead of the next cover powder & let out a little bit of monomer. Place this bead on top of the previous bead & gently blend into the natural nail.




Pick up a 3rd bead & place it on the nail. Gently blend the bead with the product on the nail for an even surface.

PRO TIPS

 If you see flaws while you are working with the cover powder, you will see them in your final look.
 So make sure you blend each bead well for a flawless, even finish.

• Cover pinks are perfect for camouflaging the flaws on toenails.








Pick up a bead of sheer pink & place it on the nail.

Letting out liquid in translucent powders can create bubbles in the product.
When camouflaging damage on the natural nail, you want the lunula to show through. This will give you the most natural look.
